Tree roots penetrate the seams of pipe and invade the sewer line. The majority of line breaks occur in Orangeburg pipe. Orangeburg, or tar paper pipe as it generally referred is now outdated.

Shrimp Skewer

- 1/2 cup canola oil
 - 1/4 cup minced fresh parsley
 - 3 tablespoons chili sauce
 - 2 tablespoons cider vinegar
 - 1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce
 - 2 garlic cloves, minced
 - 1 teaspoon coarsely ground pepper
 - 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 3/4 pound uncooked large shrimp, peeled and deveined

In a large resealable plastic bag, combine the first eight ingredients; add the shrimp. Seal bag and turn to coat; refrigerate for 30 minutes (Not longer or the vinegar will start to cook the shrimp). Drain and discard marinade.

On two metal or soaked wooden skewers, thread shrimp. Grill, covered, over medium heat for 4-5 minutes on each side or until shrimp turn pink, turning once. Yield: 2 servings.

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
